## Clergy Corner:

### **SABBATH TIME IS GOD'S GIFT TO US**

We read in the Genesis creation story the essential need that we all have for rest is built into God's plan for the ordering of everything that is. This is recapitulated in Torah with the remembrance of the Sabbath codified in the Ten Commandments. It should therefore be apparent that God is serious about the need that all creatures have for intentional periods of rest. That is why provision for sabbatical leave is built into the rector's letter of agreement with the Vestry and is a principle that is strongly encouraged by our Bishop and diocesan policy.

My agreement with our Vestry calls for three months of sabbatical leave following each five years of service. Since I was granted one month's leave last summer, I am taking two months' leave (June 14 – August 14) this year. Beverly and I thank you so much for this gift. It will provide us with a time of renewal and rest as well as allowing us time to work on some necessary projects which have been delayed due to the busyness of our respective work schedules.

During my absence, Fr. Harlie Bemis will be acting as supply priest on Sundays and will be in the office on Wednesday mornings for staff coordination and appointments. He will also be available for pastoral care for emergencies and as needed. As always our excellent deacons, Russell Smith and Ray Escott are on the job as servant ministers of God's grace. Likewise, Terry is in the office, Mary Ann is on the organ bench, Jennifer is in the Nursery and all things continue as normal. My heartfelt thanks to one and all.

In preparation for this time and as a mid-year check-in, our Vestry held a mini-retreat on June 12 to work on a short-range strategic plan looking out to 2012 and slightly beyond in terms of mission and ministry priorities which we need to engage over the next several years. Here are some things to be thinking about:

1. A new organ. I am asking the Vestry to commit to purchasing a new organ for the church by 2012. Our Anglican mode of worship demands an instrument of superior quality that will carry us for numerous decades into the future.
2. An endowment. Bishop Taylor instructed the Senior Wardens at the M&M Conference that any parish without some kind of endowment would likely not be here in 50 years. We have none. If we believe that God will still have something for us to do in this community a half century from now, we will need sufficient resources to carry that mission forward. Begin thinking now about putting St. Andrew's in your will. More on that later.
3. Stewardship. We need increased education and commitment if we are even going to sustain the level of ministry and program that we currently enjoy. Connected to that is a need to let our light shine in ways that attract people into our fellowship and encourage them to offer their spiritual

gifts as well as their financial ones. Think about ways to invite fellow seekers after truth into our fellowship, and ways to keep them here once they have come.

4. Grow our membership and witness: If you love St. Andrew's, invite a friend to come with you. Let folks know what a wonderful fellowship and ministry we have. Promote our mission and our ministry in every venue possible.

In this Sabbath time that God has given us, as we slow down program and schedule over the summer, please take time to think and pray about things. Having done that, talk to your Vestry members, giving them your vision about our common life together and how God might be calling us to reconfigure it to fit our time in this place.

## **A Message from Harlie**

I have a childhood friend and neighbor who has been a Navy Jet Pilot and more recently a helicopter pilot for the Sikorsky S61 Workhorse. His avocation over his whole life has been his fleet of renovated classical and old cars. He uses them in parades, to give friends rides, to go on vacation or to car shows around the country. He is proud as punch of these old cars and trucks. He spends joyful hours tinkering and polishing and installing different parts and accessories.

I was thinking recently of what would happen if I were to ask to borrow a car. I am sure he would volunteer to give me a ride, wherever I needed to go. However, to borrow one of his treasures would not be that easy. In my fantasy, I can imagine him paraphrasing the well known Henny Youngman line

*"Use my car? No. But, take my wife. Please take my wife but leave my cars alone."*

So often clergy get the same sort of feeling of ownership over their Churches. Fr. Tim has been with you for 15 years. Think briefly of how many baptisms and marriages he has done, each bringing him into involvement with a family. Think of the sick he has comforted, the dying with whom he has spent hours. Think of the kids with whom he has interacted. And don't forget the problems: people who leave the church over a disagreement or for no stated reason. Most of us just can't know what that does to a Priest's soul.

A priest's work involves intimacy with a lot of people. It involves being present to others in a way that leaves one vulnerable. It involves intimacy with GOD that requires a priest to make unpopular decisions. Decisions that can alienate him from friends and colleagues. When you are around a church for a while you come to realize that a priest's job is not a human choice; GOD does call and strengthen and direct Deacons and Priests.

To leave your church to the care of another Priest is far harder than loaning a friend an antique car. There is so much history. I know when I have gone away leaving a church with a supply priest, I have to turn that church over to the care of God repeatedly and still the voices

come: I hope and pray that her pregnancy will be successful this time, I must call to see how Mr. A is coping after surgery.

It is a privilege to be with you for a couple of months. I will lead services and preach. And I am available to listen and to be available to anyone who needs an ear. I have no schedule and you are welcome to call whenever you need (home—665-4054.) And be sure to remember Fr. Tim and Beverly in your prayers.

Chaplain Dalton told us there are around 200 women there, and over 75% are mothers. This prison is for women who have only 5 years to serve.

This is my ministry for St. Andrew's on-the-Hill. As I write this, you have given 220 cards that I will take to the Prison. THANK YOU, THANK YOU. But, please, don't stop, because as I fill a shoe box, I will deliver all your cards. Blank cards, we did get a lot of, and that is fine, because they then can write their personal notes also. I will ask for more birthday cards for men.

Starting around the end of August, I will be asking for Christmas Cards, so when you are getting your cards out, and find you have too many, please bring them to church and put them in the ECW slot and, if there is no room, just put them in Fr. Harlie's mailbox.
